**Course Description:** Treatment planning of complex cases requires the highest level of knowledge and skill of the treating team. Practitioners must envision the final case before starting in order to know where the goal of treatment will be directed. The orchestration of procedures, including proper sequencing and timing, makes all the difference.

**Learning Objectives:** This lecture will explore questions facing the team, including:

- Which teeth to save or extract?
- Should implants be placed immediately or in a delayed protocol?
- Should multiple implants be placed in the aesthetic zone?
- When and how to include orthodontics, if needed, for site development.
- Should the case be splinted or broken up into separate bridges or individual teeth?
- How to provisionalize the case throughout treatment.
- When to immediate load cases vs. serial extraction.
